This internship position will support our engagement of Canadian communities and schools. The intern will also provide necessary assistance to other members of the Community and Corporate team as required.

The intern will also act as the team administrative point-person for the department, helping to organize meetings, providing daily support to schools across the country. The intern will provide support for a high-volume of phone calls from schools across the country.

- Has enthusiasm to learn and grow in a fast paced fundraising environment.
