1 INSPIRE AND EDUCATE

- Schedule a National UNICEF Day kick-off assembly for your school.
- Go to unicef.ca/oct31 for announcements, the kick-off video, lesson plans and fundraising ideas to help your students learn about kids around the world.
- Track your progress on your poster! Have your students colour in the thermometer as you reach each milestone.

2 SET A GOAL

- Set a fundraising goal for your school or for each class, or ask your students to set their own individual goals.

3 TAKE ACTION!

- Print pledge forms for students to take home. Encourage them to share the stories from the video with their parents.
- Encourage your students to raise funds online (unicef.ca/oct31), through pledges and in-school events.
- Take pride in your students' achievement! At the end of the campaign, celebrate with a fun Halloween party.

You and your students can give children in remote and hard-to-reach communities a chance at an education and a brighter future. Together with your students, you can help provide life-changing supplies, such as the example items below, to where need is greatest around the world:



Pencils for a School – You could supply a school with 750 pencils, so children can write and draw.



Soccer Balls for a School – You could give children a chance to play, build skills and be kids again.



Girls' Education – You could give 5 girls the chance to safely go to school and contribute to their communities and economy.



Bicycle – You could enable a child to get to school faster, fetch water and have fun.



School-in-a-Box – You could provide children with the learning supplies they need during an emergency.



Water Pump – you could give families local access to clean, safe drinking water.

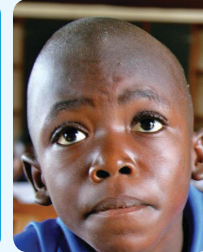

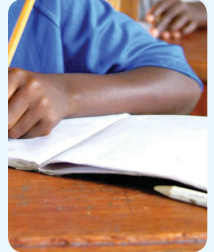
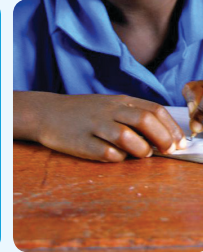
