You will help analyze and disseminate poll results for impact. You will imaginatively and actively promote awareness of U-Report, particularly among youth ages 13-24, and recruit and support youth across Canada to become U-Reporters.

The U-Report Coordinator will develop and manage strong, constructive relationships with a number of key internal and external stakeholders to ensure U-Report's successful implementation, with a focus on youth organizations.

The responsibilities of the position will include:

U-Report Administration (40%)

- Using the online chatbot application:
 - Co-develop poll questions in youth-friendly language.
 - Work on the back-end to schedule and test polls.
 - Analyze and produce poll results.
 - Assist the Steering Group to successfully implement the U-Report at a national scale.

Recruit U-Reporters (40%)

- Co-create and implement recruitment and promotion strategies and tactics for national scale.
- Work with youth and youth organizations in communities across Canada to recruit U-Reporters.
- Research, plan for and attend events.
- Build relationships with youth organizations and attend youth gatherings.

Communications and general administration (20%)

- Develop communications based on poll results.
- Develop communications strategy to recruit youth.
- Package and disseminate poll results on social media platforms and in other creative ways.
- Work with the One Youth Communications Manager to disseminate poll results and promote U-Report.

The ideal candidate will have:

- A post-secondary degree or college diploma in research analysis, social policy, communications or related discipline.
- A minimum of one (1) year's relevant work experience in communications or youth engagement.
- Experience working with statistical data.
- Proficiency in Microsoft Office software.
- An advanced capacity to work with social media platforms.
- A demonstrated ability to participate in cross-functional, multi-disciplinary teams to produce innovative strategies.
