A look back...

30 years supporting children's rights through the Chefs for UNICEF Water for life Gala

1993

The first Chefs for UNICEF Water for Life Gala is held at Chateau Halifax with 300 guests in attendance raising \$40,000.



1996

The Gala is hosted at the World Trade & Convention Centre for the first time.



2006

Cumulative revenue raised by the Gala surpasses \$1 million.



2010

Thanks to the Gala, 12,000 bed nets are provided to families in Liberia and Rwanda, protecting them from the transmission of malaria for five years.



2011

Nova Scotia musicians Bruce & Dylan Guthro perform at the 19th Annual Gala. The revenue raised by the Gala supported 24,000 people living



in 19 remote villages in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, to gain improved access to safe drinking water and live in a cholera-free environment.

2012

Thanks to the Gala, safe and clean school environments that help improve learning outcomes are created in Namibia, benefitting 22,500 students in 45



schools, and providing 34 water tanks, 8,000 jerry cans, and water purification tablets for 9,000 families.

2013

The Gala raises over \$200,000 and the Patrons Council is formed to raise awareness of UNICEF and to fundraise for



the Gala. The Gala contributes to water purification for over 16 million people across Syria, and water chlorination and waste management to reduce the number of cholera cases in South Sudan.

2014

Cumulative revenue raised by the Gala surpasses \$2 million. The funds raised by the Gala provide 10 pre-schools in a



remote province in Cambodia with water, sanitation and hygiene facilities, benefitting 22,000 people.

2015

The revenue collected through the Gala supports water facilities in 21 health centres in



Ghana, creating sanitary conditions for healthcare workers and reducing maternal and newborn deaths.

2016

Electronic bidding is used for the first time for the auction and the Gala raises \$223,000. Thanks to the Gala, boreholes are



constructed and water pumps installed in Chad, bringing clean water to schools, health centres and communities. The Gala also supported water resilience measures in the hardest to reach areas of Mongolia, ensuring access to safe drinking water for 20,000 school children.

2017

The Gala celebrates its 25th Anniversary supporting children and raises over \$268,000.



2018

The Gala is hosted at the newly constructed Halifax Convention Centre for the first time and the cumulative revenue raised by the Gala surpasses \$3 million.



2019

The 27th Annual Gala, with 500 guests in attendance, sells 46 life-saving water



pumps and 323 life-changing water for life bundles. It raises a total of \$300,000 towards our UNdaunted campaign in Uganda, which provided 210,000 girls access to safe water and latrines so they could stay in school.

2020 & 2021

The Gala transitions to an online auction amidst pandemic restrictions, raising over \$212,500 in 2020 and 2021 combined.



allowing more than 2,250 people in Uganda to have access to safe water.

2022

The Gala celebrates its 30th Anniversary, cumulatively raises over \$3.912 million, and continues to support life-changing water initiatives that are helping thousands of children around the world to live and grow up healthy.
